But don't let the rules put you off - they are fairly simple and they mean that anyone can have a go and have a chance of winning, from beginners and first-time growers to experienced show-goers.

Class 27 Top Tray Competition Rules

1. **The Top Tray class is for a collection of 3 types of vegetable taken from the following list of 15. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets and each type must consist of the same variety: Carrots (3), cauliflowers (2), onions (3), parsnips (3), peas (6 pods), potatoes (3), runner beans (6 pods), tomatoes (6), French beans (6 pods), sweetcorn (2), pepper (3), cucumber (2), courgettes (3) red beet (3), aubergines (2).** Each type of vegetable will be judged out of 20 points. This is split into three sections as follows: 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. The overall mark will be out of a total of 60.
2. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 45cm by 60cm (18in by 24in), without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray or board measuring 45cm by 60cm (18in by 24in), can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurement that must not exceed 45cm by 60cm (18in by 24in).
3. A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing, but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand or rings, will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.
4. **Prizes:**
The winner of the Top Tray will receive a Garden News Certificate plus a £10 Thompson & Morgan voucher. The runner-up will receive a £5 voucher. Third place will also receive a £5 voucher. Vouchers are for use by 31st December 2011 for seeds via mail order.

Notes for Top Tray Exhibitors and Judges

Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 7.5cm (3in).

Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached.

Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces (the green flower-bud case).

Judges may handle the exhibits, open pods and so on, to check for quality.

The tray, board or staging must not be cut or mutilated in any way at all – such as cutting holes for standing onions in.

Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Tray class, bearing in mind that entries may come from fairly inexperienced exhibitors.

The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.

Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to and decided by, the show officials.

Failure to abide by any of these rules will lead to disqualification.

Every winner and runner-up will be entered into a National competition to win a year's subscription to Garden News, £250 worth of garden centre vouchers and a Jumbo Propagator from Thompson & Morgan.

Class 44 Top Vase Competition Rules

- 1. The Top Vase class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between five and ten stems, taken from a minimum of two different KINDS of plants. Two varieties of the same plant are NOT two kinds.**
- The display will be judged out of a total of 35 points, split into 25 points for the colour form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of the flowers will be to the normal rules used for other classes.
- Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only. No seed-heads or berries will be allowed.
- The vase can be any shape or size and made from any material, but must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.
- No accessories such as bows and additional foliage will be allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to that stem, is allowed. Packing material, including florists' foam, to keep stems in place is allowed.
- Prizes:**
The winner of the Top Vase will receive a Garden News Certificate plus a £10 Thompson & Morgan voucher. The runner-up will receive a £5 voucher. Third place will also receive a £5 voucher. Vouchers are for use by 31st December 2011 for seeds via mail order.

Notes for Top Vase Exhibitors and Judges

Flowering stems can be taken from ANY flowering plant.

Different kinds of plants need to be taken from different Genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and sweet william, which are all dianthus, would not be classed as different kinds.

Only fresh, home grown flowers can be used. No dried or silk flowers are allowed.

A vase, by definition, is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.

The Top Vase class is open for anyone to enter and is not intended purely for growers who regularly display in single species classes at shows.

Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Vase class, bearing in mind that entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.

Judges should note that the display has to be viewed all round.

The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.

Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to and decided by the show officials.

Failure to abide by these rules will lead to disqualification.

Every winner and runner up will be entered into a National competition to win a year's subscription to Garden News, £250 worth of garden centre vouchers and a Jumbo Propagator from Thompson & Morgan.

LATE ENTRIES. Late entries will be allowed at the discretion of the Show Secretary at 50p per class, if space allows.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ENTRIES is 3 per person, per class.

STAGING/SETTING UP. See front cover for timetable. Cars may be brought onto the show ground when setting up and temporary passes will be available.

EXHIBIT CARDS. Please collect your exhibit cards from the Show Secretary at the main desk in the marquee when arriving to set up. All exhibits must be displayed with their exhibit card. If you wish to donate your produce for sale after prize giving, please tick the box on the back of your exhibit card(s).

SOCIETY BOARDS will be available on the day from the Show Secretary, as will a small selection of vases and paper plates.

UNFAIR COMPETITION. All plants, flowers and vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitor, with the exception of children's classes 49 & 51 and floral art classes. Pot plants must have been cared for by the exhibitor for at least 60 days prior to the show.

JUDGING. The decision of the judges is final. If any dispute arises, other than the judges' decisions, notice must be given to the Show Secretary in writing on the day of the show not later than 1.00pm. The dispute will be submitted to the committee whose decision will be final. A deposit of £1.00 must accompany all disputes which will be refunded if the dispute is upheld.

POINTS

First Prize 5 points; Second prize 3 points; Third prize 1 point.

TROPHIES. Trophies are competed for annually and must be returned to the Show Secretary three weeks prior to the show in a clean condition please.

PRIZES & PRIZE MONEY. Exhibitors will be allowed more than one prize in any class. Prize money not collected within 7 days of the show is forfeited.

PROTECTION & REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but the committee will not, in any circumstances, be responsible for loss or damage of exhibits. No exhibit may be removed until after the presentation of trophies on the day of the show. No cars will be allowed on the show ground until after 5.00 pm on the show day to remove exhibits.

HINTS & TIPS FOR NEW EXHIBITORS

We realise it can be daunting to enter your produce in a show for the first time so we have put this page together to help you. Also have a look at the New Exhibitors Section on page 6, and Class 56 in the Floral Art Section which is also for first timers, on page 14.

Fruit and Veg

All of your exhibits must be fresh and home grown.

In general the judge will be looking for good condition (no soil or blemishes, nicely ripe) and uniformity where you are exhibiting 3 or 4 of the same cultivar (cultivated variety). If the Schedule does not say "of the same cultivar" then you can mix up and exhibit different cultivars.

There will be paper plates available from the Stewards on Show Day and you might choose to display your Veg and Fruits on these plates (or bring your own plain plates) if they might roll around.

In the New Exhibitors Section:

Vegetables

4 Tomatoes: Keep the calyx on the fruit – the green flower-bud case on the top of your tom. Choose 4 of the same cultivar (e.g. Alicante), or 4 different (e.g. 1 x Alicante, 1 x Romana, 1 x Tigerella, 1 x Big Boy). Or 2 + 2. Your choice.

3 Courgettes: Choose 3 of the same cultivar or 3 different. You can choose to keep or remove the courgette flowers. Probably best to remove them carefully if they are not looking their best.

3 Carrots: Choose 3 of the same cultivar, or different, depending what you are growing. Twist the tops off to leave about 3" or 75mm of top attached.

4 Runner Beans: Leave some stalk attached. Display with tails at one end, stalks at the other.

1 Cucumber: Choose a well-shaped fruit, with or without its flower, with some stalk attached.

3 Fruits of your choice from: Apples, Pears, Plums, Damsons: Any combination you like. Mix them up or choose 3 the same. Leave some stalk on the fruit and be careful not to damage the bloom on Plums and Damsons.

Flowers

A vase is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.

A single flower in a vase: In general the judge will want to see the material in its most perfect stage of possible beauty, fresh and free from damage.

A vase of mixed flowers: Here the judge will look at the quality of the plant material as well as the balance of the arrangement itself. The judge will view the display from all round.

On Show Day

Check the schedule to see when you can Stage (set up) your exhibits and plan to arrive early. Go to the front desk in our marquee and collect your entry cards which will have been written out for you. Then one of the Stewards (we will all have a badge on) will point you in the right direction and help you set up. If you have ANY questions on show day, just ask.

It can get a bit busy in the marquee but we're all there to help.

Most of all – enjoy exhibiting and enjoy the day. You may even win a prize!

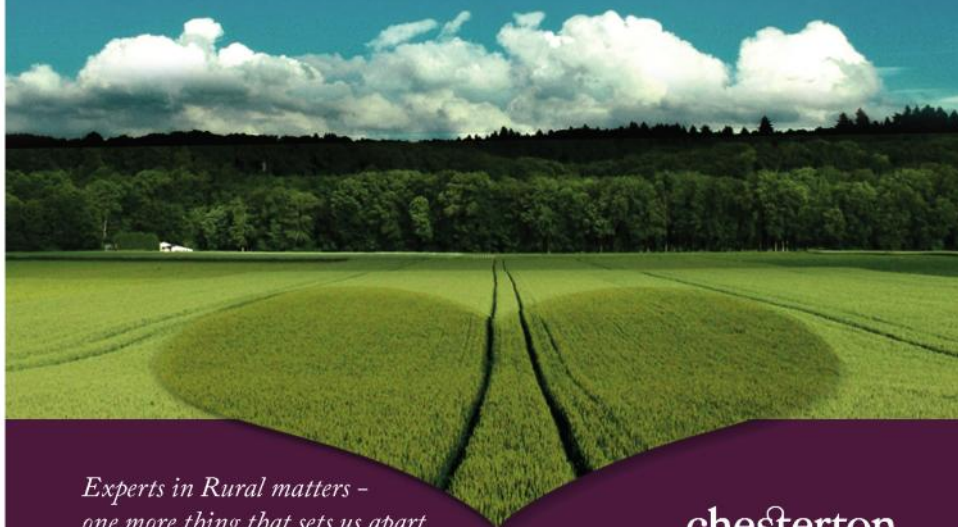
